

DEFINITION:

Food Equity is when all sectors are working together through frameworks and mechanisms that respect and deliver the human right to food for all people, at all times, with nutritional values strengthening positive physical, mental and cultural well-being; it is also climate-neutral and supports the restoration/protection of our environments, cultures, communities, local economies and future from climate change.

AANSW's definition of food equity draws on Ms Caitlin McConnel and the United Nations Committee on World Food Security definitions of food security, and has been expanded to include the range of factors that effect the equity of food, people's wellbeing and their cultures.
